Revision of the Education and Training Framework



- Education and training remains the competence of the Member States
- Harmonisation benefits all authorities, operators, staff
- Achievable through voluntary measures



Legal Framework



Art 23(2) of Directive 2010/63/EU requires that

- The staff shall be adequately educated and trained before they perform any of the following functions...
- Staff shall be supervised in the performance of their tasks until they have <u>demonstrated</u> the requisite competence



Competence is a non-negotiable prerequisite





Agreement with society

Animals can be used in research and testing **provided** that jointly agreed **laws and regulations are respected**



Why is harmonisation desired



- > Provides agreed quality standards as basis for trust
- Enables mobility of LAS staff between institutes and countries
- Transparent quality standards to reassure public that competence of staff entrusted with live animals is upheld across the EU

Diverse background



How can a quality system be trusted



- Content and criteria jointly agreed
- > Clear records
- > Full transparency in any exceptions
- > Agreements, material and tools centrally accessible



Existing Framework document



- First EU guidance document under Directive 2010/63/EU
- Endorsed 2012 and 2014
- New modules endorsed 2016
- Revision necessary
 - Parts maybe / soon to be out of date
 - Further helpful information published or under development
 - ETPLAS evolved from initial recommendation
 - CPD missing

Responsible Correspondents



- In cases, where two or more ministries are responsible for the different elements of this guidance document, feedback should be sought from all

Functions Table



- New table so that modules for each function can be easily identified
 - Discussed previously
 - Check that entries are / could be compatible with MS training
 - Any exemptions should be transparent for mutual recognition
 - Please consider what is in place
 - within the MS
 - approving / accrediting bodies
 - to be discussed later



Roles Table



- New table so that modules for each role can be easily identified
 - Discussed previously
 - Check that entries are / could be compatible with MS training
 - Any exemptions should be transparent for mutual recognition
 - Please consider what is in place
 - within the MS
 - approving / accrediting bodies
 - To be discussed later



Exemptions



- Exemptions for functions already included in endorsed document
- Now adds exemptions from roles
- Other text relevant to exemptions from completing particular Learning Outcomes



Status of Module 50 – Introduction to the local environment (establishment) for persons taking specific roles under the Directive



Group agrees that this module would be useful and promote understanding and compliance if it were completed by **all** staff working under the Directive, not just "Roles" as has been used in the draft version

- This can only be delivered at the level of the establishment as it involves specific descriptions of how the establishment works
- Should not be generic but specific to establishment
- It is unlikely to be approved or accredited, but can be inspected



Role - Person Responsible for Care and Welfare (user establishments only)



Should this person understand about design of projects and procedures - New "requirement"

- Should they complete design of procedures and projects level 1 (10)?
 - Abelson diagram (career development section) suggests yes
- Before taking up position / as CPD?



Positioning of use of live animals section



- Trainees usually come in contact with live animals in modular training
- Need to do so to fulfil requirements of
 - LO 3.2.1 DEMONSTRATE competent handling.... (not use)
 - 6.2.1 Proficiently and competently CARRY OUT euthanasia.....
 (not use if Annex IV method)
 - 8.3 PERFORM minor techniques under supervision.... (can use models e.g. Kokin rat)



Positioning of use of live animals section



- Animals are not always "used" during modular training but if they are then project authorisation is required
 - Information provided for applicants and evaluators



Positioning of use of live animals section



- Most appropriate to position this section in the document within the modular training section
 - Most uses of animals will be later on in career path
 - In some cases, ALL uses of animals will be after initial training



Modules



- Pre-existing
 - Theory
 - Skills
 - Species specificity

New

- 12-Severity
- 27-Competence assessor
- 52-Searching for non-animal alternatives
- 60-Developing non-animal alternatives for regulatory use – not for endorsement



Role of ETPLAS



- ETPLAS was established and has evolved since the endorsed Framework document
- Not all relevant stakeholders are aware of the progress
- AP 09 to update you

Mentioned as one of the roles of ETPLAS:

"Providing e-learning modules and courses with certificates for all stakeholders in LAS education." (page 63)

- Developed in response to an expressed need
- Investment vs promotion



E-modules and exam tool

new paragraph proposed



- ✓ To be appropriately incorporated by course organisers, often as pre-course learning material or flipped classroom/ blended learning
- ✓ Stand-alone to use in CPD
- Will remain free of charge to use
- Paid exam tool will be available for course providers
